CHANGING THE SYSTEM

Dear George,

The U.S. imprisons more people than any country in the world, with over 2.4 million people behind bars and about 2.7 million children in the U.S. with an incarcerated parent. Poor people and people of color are incarcerated at

vastly disproportionate rates, and few resources are invested in reentry or community programs.
